In our Key Stage 1 assembly this week we asked the children if they would always follow a leader. The children listened to some stories about leadership and then had to make some decisions about whether they would support certain leadership decisions. They were brilliant at making some tricky decisions and gave great explanations for their choices.

In Key Stage 2 the children learnt about hibernation, looking at bats, butterflies, dormice and hedgehogs. They linked this to our big question by discussing what we can learn from them, specifically the importance of rest – after all, every good leader needs time to rest!

Year 3 news

Year 3 started their Greek topic this term with a dress up day! The children started the day by experiencing a labyrinth in their classroom. They had to get to the centre where the minotaur, which we have been learning about in our English lessons, was waiting. They only had 20 seconds each to get in and out. In those 20 seconds the children had to collect 6 pieces of paper which either gave them points or took points away as it described an action with the minotaur. We then moved on to learning about the differences between ancient Greece and modern Greece. We used atlases to help us label maps of Greece. The children loved tasting Greek food; we made tzatziki by grating cucumber and adding it to Greek yogurt along with some mint, we dipped some pitta bread in this...yum! We had olives and feta but the clear favourite was Greek yogurt and honey. The children then each made a vase based on last week's learning about Greek vases using the pinching and the coiling methods. They are now drying ready to be painted next week!


